Note: All tips assume you are using a program that allows you to layer text boxes such as Adobe InDesign or Microsoft PowerPoint or other similar programs.

### Using the Regular Font

The regular version of this font will type squares with transparent holes where the letters belong. This can be used alone like this:

#### hi,li'mk9Lau9hterLines!

You may notice that spaces show up as blank spots. If you'd like them filled, use the = sign. You can use two = signs for more space!

The following sentence was typed like this:

==I'll==see==you==in==the==future==when==we're==older=

### I'LL See you in the future when we're older

If you want to add fancy end caps to the letters, you can!

Use the [] < > and {} keys to add different ends!

Experiment to see what you like best.

Try adding a different color to each box. Use ends to try new styles! <=cross=] <=my=] <=heart=] {=and=} {=hope=} {=to=} {=die=}

## Adding the Base and Big Base Layers

The base version of this font will type solid squares that are the right height and width to use to layer behind the original font.

original: his im ky Laughter Lines!

base:

If you copy and paste the exact sentence you've typed in the regular font into a new text box in the base font, you can layer them.

==I'll==see==you==in==the==future==when==we're==older=

I'll see you in the future when we're older

+

#### = I'LL See you in the future when we're older

You can add a third layer with the big base version of the font. It's slightly taller than the regular base and gives you a border if you put it on the bottom. Stack them top-to-bottom: regular, base, big base.

If you are not using an end cap, when you use the big base layer you can even things up using the \ key. It gives just a tinch of extra width. <=cross=] <=my=] <=heart=] {=and=} \=hope=to=die=\
